Food for thought: Since many have undertaken to compile a narrative about the events that have been fulfilled among us, just as they were handed on to us by those who from the beginning were eyewitnesses and servants of the word, I, too, decided, as one having a grasp of everything from the start, to write a well-ordered account for you, most excellent Theophilus, so that you may have a firm grasp of the words in which you have been instructed. -Luke 1:1-4

As we embark on a new year of the church calendar, beginning with the first weekend of Advent, our guiding voice of the gospel story shifts. Each year, in a three year cycle, the lens from which we will be presented the gospel story changes; Matthew, Mark and Luke. Now, we are entering the year of Luke's gospel account.

What does this mean? We are going on a journey. The image that gets assigned to the gospel of Luke is that of a journey. In this gospel account, Jesus is always on the move. Luke's narrative spends the most on Jesus' journey, along with the company of the disciples and the crowd, getting to Jerusalem. Along the way, opportunity presents itself often for Jesus' teaching through parables, acts of healing and liberation, as well as attention to the poor and outcast.

Hospitality, worship and prayer are some of the overarching themes in Luke's gospel account. Every chapter of this narrative contains a reference to food. These are used as illustrations for the kingdom of God. And, Luke's telling of the gospel begins and ends in prayer and worship.

I offer these highlights of Lukes' gospel so that we might collectively begin to get into the mindset of this journey for which we will travel together, as a congregation, over the next year. As the introduction of the gospel states, "so that you may have a firm grasp of the words in which you have been instructed"; the author of this book has written it to be used for instruction and discussion.

As we enter this season in which much of our society has cultivated long traditions of sharing food and greater attention to hospitality, I would challenge us to think of and implement ways in which we might engage in conversations of the gospel story as we dine together. Consider sharing scripture alongside your table prayer. A topic for discussion around the dinner table might be sparked by the question of, what is your favorite gospel account and why. If you are one to prepare and distribute goodie plates, one addition might be a card containing a scripture prayer that guides you through this season of hope.

#### The Seasons of Advent, Christmas and Epiphany

- Advent; season of preparation, waiting and hope
  - The season of Advent is celebrated in the four weeks leading up to Christmas Eve. Blue is the color of the season, with the option pink being brought out to celebrate the role of Angels in the Christmas narrative. Each week, more light is added to the Advent wreath as anticipation builds for the birth of the Messiah.
- Christmas; season of promise, proclamation and celebration
  - Although Christmas gets labeled as the time spanning from the day after Thanksgiving (or earlier) through December 25th, it is actually only 12 days, as the song declares; beginning with Christmas Eve.
- Epiphany; season of light
  - Beginning on January 6th, the length of this season is dependent on Easter Day in that year. If Lent begins early, the season of Epiphany is short. In 2025, we have six weeks in the season of Epiphany! The most weeks possible for this season is seven.

# What Wondrous Love Is This Appeal Update and Thank You!

## ONE STOP, HEALTH BOX



#### Narcan Availability at Church

What is Narcan? NARCAN®, or naloxone, is a lifesaving medication used to rapidly reverse opioid overdose. It binds to opioid receptors in the brain, counteracting the effects of opioids and restoring normal respiration. This product is administered as a nasal spray in emergency situations.

Why would we need this at church? Anyone taking prescription pain medication could suffer from an accidental overdose. Our building is a community gathering space and Narcan has become an essential item for safety/first aid kits.

In case of an emergency, where can I access Narcan at St. Peter? There are two boxes in our building, each containing two doses (one applicator = one dose). One box is in the conference room, near the first aid kit, in the lower cupboard by the fridge. Another box can be found in the kitchen, next to the phone.


#### A Worship Walk at La Riviere Park
